Tree Seedling Sale

Winter may be upon us, but it's time to think Spring because the Pickaway Soil and Water Conservation District Annual Tree Seedling Sale is here! This sale is open to everyone, as a low cost source of plant materials for conservation uses.

Tree and shrub seedlings, ground cover, and various seed mixes are offered in this year's sale. They are available to anyone and may be planted without restriction. These products are excellent for wildlife habitat, windbreaks, landscaping, stream buffers, ground cover, Christmas trees, and more.

These seedlings are 1-3 years old and average 6-18 inches in height. Seedlings are bare rootstock. They are dipped into a preservative gel to keep them moist, and then placed into a plastic bag. Each packet can be carried in one hand. Please send someone to pickup your seedlings, if you are not able to come yourself. If the seedlings are not picked up on the specified date, the District can not be responsible for the condition of the seedlings. The District does not offer reimbursements for any trees that do not survive.

Also available this year, in addition to tree seedlings, are Pheasant Forever seed mixes. The seed mixes have been designed by wildlife professionals to provide diverse, high-quality, and long-lasting wildlife habitats. The mixes meet Ohio Department of Agriculture standards and exceed NRCS conservation standards. Both of these seed mixes meet criteria set forth by Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) for Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) practice PLT15 - Establish pollinator and/or beneficial insect habitat. In addition they also meet criteria set forth by Farm Service Agency (FSA) for Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) practice CP42 - Pollinator Habitat. If you are purchasing seed for either of these programs, please be sure to follow all Standards and Specifications as directed from NRCS and/or FSA. Seed will be sold in 1/2 acre increments.

Order forms and payment are due to the Pickaway SWCD on **FEBRUARY 15, 2017**. You may use the form included in this newsletter or find the form on the District website. Tentative order distribution date is set for **APRIL 14, 2017**. A postcard or email will be sent to confirm exact pick up dates, location, and times. Seedlings should be planted within 5 days after pick up and watered regularly to assure their vitality.

FISH FINGERLING SALE

Pickaway SWCD is conducting our annual fish fingerling sale! Descriptions of the available fish and an order form can be found in this newsletter and on our website. New this year for purchase are Japanese Koi, 40 pound bags of fish food, and a pond book!

Fish orders, with payment, must be in the SWCD office by **March 27th**. Fingerlings must be picked up at the Pickaway County Fairgrounds on **March 30th**. Fish are guaranteed to be delivered in good condition, however, we cannot guarantee survival after being picked up.

Deciduous Trees

Type of Tree	Mature Height	Ideal Growing Conditions
Black Cherry	60+ft	Tolerate a variety of conditions
Black Walnut	75ft	Prefers fertile, deep soils
Northern Red Oak	80+ft	Full sun and acidic soil
Sugar Maple	100+ft	Partial to full sun; well- drained soil
White Oak	100+ft	Shade tolerant, best in deep, sandy loam on south and west facing slopes

Coniferous Trees

Type of Tree	Mature Height	Ideal Growing Conditions
Bald Cypress	100-120ft	Very wet soils, muck, clay, or fine sand
Canadian Hemlock	60-75ft	Cool, moist locations
Colorado Blue Spruce	100+ft	Prefers full sun, moist soil
Eastern White Pine	80ft+	Prefers full sun; shade tolerant
Norway Spruce	100ft	Grows well on most sites
Scotch Pine	50-80ft	Well-drained, dry soil and full sun

Annual Conservation Poster Contest

Calling local young artists in grades 4 through 9: it's time to break out the colored pencils and paint again for the PSWCD Soil and Water Stewardship poster contest! The contest is open to all Pickaway County students (public, private, and home schooled) who are currently in 4th through 9th grade.

"Healthy Soils are Full of Life" is the 2017 theme, as selected by the National Association of Conservation Districts. The purpose of the poster contest is to provide students with an opportunity to share their thoughts about



soil, water, and related natural resource issues and to carry their message into Pickaway County. Pickaway SWCD can provide educational materials to introduce students to the theme of healthy soils. Call (740) 477-1693 to request these materials.

Posters will be judged in two grade level categories: <u>Grades 4-6</u> or <u>Grades 7-9</u>. Awards will be handed out in each category. First Place winners will receive \$25 and Second Place entries will receive \$10. Both First and Second Place will receive Medallions and their posters will be featured on placemats in restaurants around Pickaway County! Several posters from each classroom will receive Honorable Mention Rosettes. All other participants will receive Participation Ribbons. First, Second, and Honorable Mention posters will be displayed in the Pickaway County Library during Soil and Water Stewardship Week, April 30 - May 7, 2017. First place posters advance to the State Contest with a chance to advance to the National Contest.

ENVIROTHON

The Area 5 Envirothon will be held on Tuesday, April 25th. This year's contest is being held at Scioto Grove Metro Park, south of Grove City on State Route 104.

Any High School teacher or Home School group is allowed to form a five-student team to compete in the Envirothon. Students are tested on their knowledge of soils, forestry, wildlife, aquatic ecology and current environmental issues. In addition, the Envirothon encourages cooperative decision making and team building. Schools are allowed to send up to three teams per school and are encouraged to think about forming a freshman team, so they gain experience in competing. Registration forms and release forms are due by **Friday**, **March 31st**.

This June, the State Envirothon is being held in Pickaway County at the Ohio Christian University. We would love to have a team chosen to represent Pickaway County while the state contest is held in our own backyard!

Students must complete an Entry Form (with parent signature) and tape it to the back of their poster. The Poster Contest Entry Blank can be printed from the PSWCD website <u>www.pickawayswcd.org</u>. Posters must be to the PSWCD office by **Friday**, **March 24th**.

NRCS News

Enrollment applications for Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) being accepted now through February 3rd

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is currently accepting applications for enrollment in the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP), the nation's largest conservation program.

NRCS has made several updates to the program this year to help producers better evaluate and see the benefits of their conservation options. New methods and software will help producers see why they are or are not meeting stewardship thresholds and allow them to pick practices and enhancements that work for their conservation objectives. These new tools also allow producers to

see potential payment scenarios for conservation early in the process. "This year, the Conservation Stewardship Program provides even more opportunities for conservation and greater flexibility at the local level to prioritize resource concerns and conservation approaches," says Terry Cosby, State Conservationist in Ohio." Customized CSP tools for Ohio will improve the customer experience during application evaluations."

NRCS offices will accept applications through February 3, 2017.

People interested in the additional opportunities offered through the updated CSP can find information on the new CSP portal, located at http://www.nrcs.usda.gov/csp. This one-stop shop, which provides information to help producers determine whether CSP is right for them, will be continually updated as more information becomes available. Changes that producers can expect to see include nearly double the enhancements and conservation practices offered and better reporting tools to tell producers the results of their conservation efforts on their land.

Through CSP, agricultural producers and forest landowners earn payments for actively managing, maintaining, and expanding conservation activities like cover crops, ecologically-based pest management, buffer strips, and pollinator and beneficial insect habitat – all while maintaining active agriculture production on their land. CSP also encourages the adoption of cutting-edge technologies and new management techniques. NRCS has addressed producer and stakeholder input requesting greater flexibility to address local resource concerns. Producers will be better prepared to apply because they will know these local ranking priorities and targeted resource concerns. CSP is for producers who are already established conservation stewards, helping them to deliver multiple conservation benefits on working lands, including improved water and soil quality and enhanced wildlife habitat.

2017 Pickaway SWCD Fish Fingerling Descriptions and Approximate Sizes



<u>Black Crappie</u>

2-4" fingerling- a sport fish; can grow 5-12", prefer more aquatic vegetation

Channel Catfish

4-5" fingerling- a sport and food fish; spawns are forage for bass; can grow up to 14"; easier to catch after a hard rain

Fathead Minnow

1-2" fingerling- a forage fish; can grow to 3"; readily consumed by predatory species

Hybrid Bluegill 2-4" fingerling- a forage and sport fish; can grow to 10"; the primary prey of largemouth bass

Largemouth Bass

2-3" fingerling- primarily a sport fish; can grow over 25" and 14 lbs.; ravenous predatory feeder; will eat anything that fits in mouth

<u>Japanese Koi</u>

6-8"- Maximum length is 3ft; do best in ponds with more than one koi; get along well with other, non-aggressive fish; great for controlling duckweed and other aquatic weeds

Redear Sunfish

2-4"- closely related to the bluegill; popular pan fish; can grow up to 11"; eats snails, crayfish and small fish

White Amur (Grass Carp)

8-14"- good for aquatic weed control

Yellow Perch

2-3" fingerling- requires brush or weeds to lay eggs during the first part of April

Fish Food

40 pound bags of Melick 47% protein fish food

Fish pick up will be on March 30th beginning at 10:30am Pick up location will be at the Pickaway County Fairgrounds Order forms are due by March 27th.

- Bring a 10-20 gallon garbage can or 5 gallon bucket
- Line container with non-deodorized plastic liner
 Fill half full of your own pond water
